A Lesson from a Turtle

Some time ago. I saw a turtle crossing the road ahead of me. You feel sorry for those turtles when they are trying to make their way safely across a busy highway. On occasion, I have even stopped to help them across. It seems that they feel invincible. When a car zooms by, the turtle will pull its head into its shell. Evidently, they believe that their shell will provide protection from a two-ton car! But turtle shells do not offer that kind of protection. Way too often they will die. There are times in life when the best thing you can do is run, even if you are a turtle. There are things that the shell is not strong enough to resist!

How true this is with us as humans. We often have too much confidence in our own abilities. Why is it that we think we can peacefully co-exist with those things that tempt us? We try to see just how close we can get to those things that are the greatest temptations for us. There is a word for people who hang out around their weaknesses. The word is "Victim"! We often forget just how much we really need God. Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians 10:12 "Therefore let him who thinks he stands take heed lest he fall." God tells us that there are times to flee. We are to run from sexual entrapment as did Joseph in Genesis (Genesis 39:12). Avoid evil friends as Paul exhorts us in his letter to the Church at Corinth (1 Corinthians 15:33). Don't try to tough it out in your own shell. Some things are bigger than you are. There are things in life that will kill your soul! I have seen more than one fallen child of God whose fall was a result of over confidence in themselves. They believed that they were

in control of things, and then found out, too late, that things were in control of them. Don't die in your shell on the highway of life! Phillip
