What a joy it is to return to worship! We are all



excited about seeing each other again. As we do so, the shepherds have listed some guidelines below. These are for your safety and the safety of others. The guidelines are for the month of May. There will be no Sunday night and Wednesday Bible classes during May.

THINGS TO CONSIDER BEFORE YOU COME

- We strongly encourage people who are 65 or older, and others especially at risk (diabetes, heart disease, and immune deficiencies, etc.) to participate in the service by way of our livestream.
- You should stay at home & watch the worship service on livestream if:
- ♦ You have been in close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19.
- Vou are experiencing a cough, shortness of breath, or sore throat.
- ◊ You have had a fever in the 48 hours prior to Sunday.
- ◊ You have experienced new loss of taste or smell.
- ◊ You have experienced vomiting or diarrhea in the 24 hours prior to Sunday.
- Wearing a face mask is suggested, but not required.
- There will be no Children's Bible Hour or Attended Nurserv at this time.

WHEN YOU COME INTO THE BUILDING

• Enter the building only through the east and west main entrances to the auditorium. All other doors will be locked. The main entrance doors will be open, so that no one is required to touch the handles. You will also find this to be true with the doors entering into the auditorium. Do not touch the handles of any doors.

(Covid-19 Guidelines Continued)

- The main entrance doors will remain open throughout the worship to circulate outside air. Also, our inside unit fans will continuously run.
- Someone will be present to hand you a prepackaged communion cup. This cup will contain both the juice and the wafer.
- There will be hand sanitizer on tables at each entrance. Please use the sanitizer as you enter the building.
- Since we have not seen each other for a while, we will want to hug and shake hands. Currently, we must restrain from hugging or shaking hands. Elbow bumps, thumbs up, or a friendly wave are appropriate.
- Practice recommended social distancing, at least six feet between people of different households, to the greatest extent possible.


WHILE IN THE AUDITORIUM:

- You will find pews that have tape on them. You are not to sit in these pews. Two rows will be left empty between each occupied row. Family members may sit together, (We encourage families to sit together) as long as there is a six-foot separation on either side of the family.
- Practice good etiquette when coughing or sneezing.
- There will be no "Meet and Greet" at the beginning of the service.
- Be mindful of your children and keep them in the auditorium.
- The Lord's Supper will be observed at the conclusion of the sermon.
- · Your contribution should be placed in the baskets on the tables as you exit the building.

AS YOU LEAVE:

- Remember not to touch any door handles.
- Exit only through the east and west main entrances.
- There will be trash bags at each door for your empty communion cups.
- Use hand sanitizer as you exit.

Finally! We are, albeit very differently than before, able to worship together again! It's been 2 months since we were all able to be in the same building, this is going to be so awesome come Sunday! Many of us have been craving this since the beginning of the pandemic. While home worship has been a blessing, it just hasn't been the same. I think I have worshipped in my pajamas many times, ha! As we get ready to come back together, let's ask ourselves a question. Are you ready? Are we ready to get in that frame of mind that may have been a little relaxed at home? There are some things for us to remember about worship (wherever we are worshipping from), here are some things to think about: We must have an attitude of gratitude (James 1:17) about worship, not everyone around the world is able to worship as freely as us. To have this attitude we must have an attitude of recognition. What does that mean? Well, there are some things we must recognize about God to be able to be grateful in worship. First thing we should remember is how unworthy (Psalm 51:1-4) we are, yet we have a God who wants and allows us to worship Him! We should recognize God's power (Job 26:14) and that we are worshipping the almighty! We should recognize His holiness (Isa, 6:3) and give reverence to it during worship. God's mercy should be something we recognize as well (John 3:16), this mercy is why we are able to worship Him. Finally, we should recognize the seriousness of worship.
