Barrier's Blog

Imagine there were some soldiers facing an onslaught of enemy
soldiers. Their general arrives and they are relieved. They ask
him if he brought the "big guns" to win the battle. He answers,
I've got your weapon. The soldiers look at him and look back at
the oncoming enemy, then looking back at the general he hands
them a match. A match! Seems ridiculous, right? Sometimes in
a fight the smallest of things can ignite a fire worthy of victory or
defeat. One of the wildfires in California a couple of years back
was found to have been started by a small child playing with one
match. One match started a fire that burned thousands of acres
of land and destroyed many businesses and homes. One little
match caused all of that destruction. The match burned out quick-
ly, but the fire that it started burned for weeks. The Bible tells us
about something that we have that is small but can destroy us as
well. In James 3:5-8 the Bible says...*Even so the tongue is a little
member and boasts great things. See how great a forest a little
fire kindles! And the tongue [is] a fire, a world of iniquity. The
tongue is so set among our members that it defiles the whole
body, and sets on fire the course of nature; and it is set on fire by
hell. For every kind of beast and bird, of reptile and creature of
the sea, is tamed and has been tamed by mankind. But no man
can tame the tongue. [It is] an unruly evil, full of deadly poison.*

The way we say things and the things that we say can cause
much harm. Our tongues, though small, have the ability to teach
God's Word and help save someone for eternity and also can turn
someone away from God and lead to an eternal separation. As
children of God we must realize the power of our words and that
we must be careful in what we say. In our youth we always heard
that sticks and stones may break my bones, but words can never
hurt me. Unfortunately, that's just not true according to the Bible.
Our words can burn like a destructive wildfire if we aren't careful.
How are you using your voice for God?
