

Thanksgiving and Covid-19

The apostle Paul wrote on one occasion, "giving thanks always for all things to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ," (Ephesians 5:20). This is strong! "Always?" "For all things?" How about most things? As you first read these words, you want to proclaim, "This is easy for you to say, Paul." However, it really was not easy for Paul to say this. When Paul wrote these words, he was in prison. He knew that the chances were good that he would never get out of that prison. Yet he said, "giving thanks always for all things".

This Thanksgiving you may be wondering, "How can I have the attitude of gratitude in my heart with all that is going on around me in this country?" You have taken every precaution that you can to avoid contracting covid-19. Yet, it seems to be getting worse and more people are dying from it. The virus has taken a tremendous toll on your finances. Because of the precautions you must take, it is difficult to go anywhere and do anything. This could just be the year where you are hard pressed to find one blessing for which to be thankful.

The guestion is, "How do you maintain gratitude in your heart no matter what is going on in your life?" The answer can be found in Psalm 97. I do not know who wrote this Psalm. Whoever wrote it was carried away with God. He was awed by who God was. The Psalmist wants us to know that no matter what else is going on in our lives, we can always be thankful for who God is, and because of what He does. He writes. "The LORD reigns: Let the earth rejoice: Let the multitude of isles be glad! Clouds and darkness surround Him; Righteousness and justice are the foundation of His throne. A fire goes before Him, And burns up His enemies round about. His lightnings light the world; The earth sees and trembles. The mountains melt like wax at the presence of the LORD. At the presence of the Lord of the whole earth. The heavens declare His righteousness, And all the peoples see His glory. Let all be put to shame who serve carved images, Who boast of idols. Worship Him, all you gods. Zion hears and is glad. And the daughters of Judah rejoice Because of Your judgments. O LORD. For You, LORD, are most high above all the earth; You are exalted far above all gods. You who love the LORD, hate evil! 
1) Sunday, December 13th, we will have our **annual contribution to reduce the principal** owed on our building loan. This gift is *meant to be in addition to your regular contribution*.
