Our Next SUPER SUNDAY is May 1st

Please plan to be with us and bring a friend!

In our series about how to be a good neighbor, based on the story of the Good Samaritan, we have seen that a good neighbor doesn't ignore someone in need, doesn't deny that someone is in need and a good neighbor has compassion. As we look at the story, we see a couple of other things. This week we look at how a neighbor doesn't have a qualifying list of prerequisites. In Luke 10:33 it says when the Samaritan saw the man, he had compassion, that compassion became action. We have already seen a Levite and a Priest pass him by. Obviously they had limitations or qualifiers on whether or not they would help someone in need. We see many things that might have kept the Samaritan away like the others. The robbers could still be nearby, it would take a lot of time to help someone (our time is precious to us), it would take a lot of his resources to help and the man was basically a sworn enemy because of his nationality. Despite all of this, the man helped! Sometimes we think of reasons not to be a good neighbor (we place pre-qualifications on whether someone is worthy of our help) instead of springing to action like the Samaritan man. Are you a good neighbor or are you making excuses?
