Instead, they focused on Jesus and continued to do the work of the kingdom! This wouldn't have been possible if they had let those two moments of weak faith define them. Instead they learned from it and let their relationship with Jesus define them. The lesson for us is that no matter how bad it gets, no matter how far off track things may seem, don't let those bad moments define you. Get back on track with Jesus. Let Him lead you, and let that relationship define you rather than the failures in life! Are you defined by your relationship with Jesus?
