Light From Above

Have you ever heard of seasonal depression? In the last couple of weeks, I feel like I have seen a lot of posts online about how to beat this problem. If you've never heard of it, here is what Wikipedia says about the disorder,

"Seasonal affective disorder, or seasonal depression, is a mood disorder subset, in which people who have normal mental health throughout most of the year exhibit depressive symptoms at the same time each year, commonly but not always in the wintertime, with reduced sunlight."

Dr. Norman E. Rosenthal, a psychiatrist and scientist, was the first to diagnose this disorder. Rosenthal wondered why he became sluggish during the winter after moving from sunny South Africa to New York. He theorized it was due to the cloudiness of NYC in the winter and began to experiment with increased exposure to artificial light. He found this made a dramatic difference, and in 1984 published his discoveries.

I think as Christians we can look at these results and understand that God has created humans to be in sunlight, and when we are removed from that environment, it affects our mood, mental health, and even connection to reality. As we think about our need for exposure to the S-U-N, we can make the comparison to the world's need to be connected to the S-O-N.

While seasonal depression has its claws in some, there is a spiritual depression that is affecting much more of our population. Many have lost or never found the connection with Jesus Christ, the Son of God. The lack of exposure to Jesus results in an increase in sin and selfishness, and a decrease in hope and joy. The sin sick world needs to bask in the glorious light of Jesus the Son.

Matthew 5:14 tells Christians that they "are the light of the world" and that Christians should "let your light shine before others." The world needs the light of Christ, and this week you might just be the one to bring that to someone. I pray that you have your eyes opened this week for opportunities to shine your light in a dark place. I pray that through your Christian love, example, and good deeds that someone might see Christ and His wonderful light though you.
